Who/what is Hemantic?

Hemantic is a globe-spanning Christian songwriting collaboration between Paul Carey and Jonny Snowball. Jonny lives in Guildford, England and Paul in Porirua, NZ.

How did Prayer Song Evenings come about?

God showed Paul a dream or vision in early 2013 and "prayer song evening" was the best words he could come up with to describe what God showed him he was to do.

The thing that struck Paul most about what he was shown, was that people's lives were changed by taking part in a Prayer Song Evening. Now there is absolutely nothing that Hemantic can do to make anything like that happen. Only God has the power to change lives. All we can do is put our trust in him and give him all glory, honour and praise.

Based upon what Paul had been shown, the full Prayer Song Evening concept was then developed by doing trial runs in Paul's local church, but the plan from the start was to establish a format that could be easily taken on the road to be done in other churches or places with facilities to host a Prayer Song Evening.

What is a Prayer Song Evening?

A Prayer Song Evening is not a gig or concert. It is not intended to bring glory to the performers, but rather to the God we serve. The purpose is not entertainment, although we do hope that people like our songs. Our aim is to help people to connect with God, perhaps in a way they may not have done before.

On the inside front cover of this Guide are some of the things that people who have come to a Prayer Song Evening have said about it. These testimonies describe most eloquently what a Prayer Song Evening is all about!

Who is a Prayer Song Evening for?

Although anyone who wishes would be welcome to attend, the primary audience for a Prayer Song Evening would be people who are already Christians. A Prayer Song Evening is certainly not intended to be an evangelistic event. It is more about developing a person's faith and connection with God than about establishing it for the first time. Because of the type of music and the format, it is also likely to be of more interest to a person of more mature years than it would be to a younger person.

What do you mean by a "prayer song"?

What we call "prayer songs" are typically songs addressed to God that involve praise, thanksgiving, intercession, petition, or confession. Some are based on specific Psalms, but most

draw inspiration widely from the whole breadth of the Bible (and from mainstream Christian teaching and practice). All are based on scripture.

As well as a “standard” Prayer Song Evening with a variety of prayer songs on various topics, we have also developed two special Prayer Song Evenings, each featuring 10 songs, one based on the Lord’s Prayer and the other on Psalm 23. A Prayer Song Evening at your place could be in any of these formats. If you have a preference please discuss this with us when making a booking.

What happens at a Prayer Song Evening?

While people are arriving and for a few minutes after the stated start time, a “welcome” presentation is displayed on the projector screen while accompanying quiet music is played. This presentation incorporates explanations about what a Prayer Song Evening is (and is not) and is intended to set the scene for the evening and to help differentiate it from a gig or concert which people may typically have prior experience of.

The evening proper involves solo performance of songs using backing tracks, interspersed with periods of silent reflection (the periods of silence usually incorporate the brief reading of some words of scripture).

Although people attending are told they are welcome to just listen to the songs, they will also be able to try singing along if they wish, or alternatively to speak the words, either out loud or silently in their head - the song words are projected on a screen.

What kind of “stage set” do you use?

We use simple stage lighting to establish a small “stage” at ground level usually in one corner of the room. The “stage” incorporates a data projector and screen, microphones and amplifier. LED candles are used to enhance the reflective setting. All the required equipment is brought with us to the venue. See the front cover of this Guide for a photo of a typical “stage set”.

What kind of room arrangement do you use?

Apart from the “stage set”, the rest of the room is left dark with chairs spread out around the room both in small crescent-shaped groups and singly (we have found that Prayer Song Evenings appeal to introverts and having some chairs set out singly gives implicit “permission” for such people to sit alone if they wish to). Note that a prayer song evening is not really intended to be a mass attendance event.

What would someone hosting a Prayer Song Evening need to provide?

- A small- to medium-sized hall or a large room with an electricity supply and curtains/blinds to enable the space to be made dark (particularly during summertime).
- People to attend the evening! (we can help with advertising resources/posters/leaflets etc).

Would prayer ministry need to be provided ?

If you have a prayer ministry team available, this might be helpful. However it is not an essential requirement.

What does it cost to host a Prayer Song Evening?

There is no charge for a Prayer Song Evening, either to those hosting or those attending. Where the location is some distance away from Porirua/Wellington, a contribution from the host towards travel costs would be appreciated.

At Prayer Song Evenings an opportunity is provided for those attending to give koha. This is usually donated to dcm, a charity who do amazing work with homeless people in Wellington (see www.dcm.org.nz for further details).
